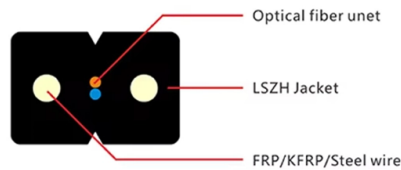


Cambodia Long-Span Bridge Structure



Overview

PHNOM PENH: The Neak Loeung Bridge, also known as the Tsubasa Bridge, is a magnificent cable-stayed bridge that spans the mighty Mekong River in Cambodia. It is the longest bridge in the country, measuring a staggering 2,215 meters. ^ Also called 3rd Cambodia–China Friendship Bridge. Located on the Indonesian peninsula, it borders Vietnam on its east side, Thailand on the west, and Laos on the north. The capital is Phnom Penh, which is located on the west side of the point where the Tonle Sap.
