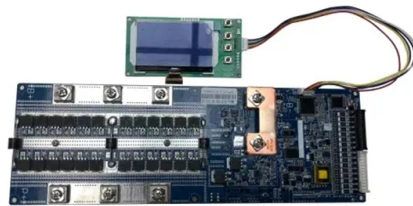

Optical modules typically have an electrical interface on the side that connects to the inside of the system and an optical interface on the side that connects to the outside. Polarity in fiber optic networks refers to the alignment of transmit (Tx) and receive (Rx) signals between interconnected devices. In fiber optics, data travels from the Tx port of one device to the Rx port of another, forming a two-way communication path.
